- **10. Publish an annual Value for Money statement** that shows how your Council Tax is being spent in every service area.

Leader's Statement

We all want to see our City and our Region thrive. Newcastle and the North East have so much to offer. We have fantastic people, thriving businesses straining to be unleashed, and world-class education institutions.

Empowerment of Communities

We believe in the power of the grassroots, empowering everyone to have a stake and a say in their local area. That's why we believe so strongly in working with communities to decide on local investment.

Investing in the Community and Voluntary Sector makes sense: not only does it support valued local initiatives, it also takes the pressure off front-line services, like in social care, which has some of the highest day-to-day costs.

And if you are experiencing hardship, you can count on the Liberal Democrats to ensure you have a local safety net, not a greater chance of experiencing further difficulty. That's why we would reverse cuts to crisis support, and end the uncertainty over homelessness support.





Leadership of Place

Newcastle Liberal Democrats have massive ambitions for the City. With the delivery of new devolution powers to the Region, even under a flawed model, we stand to benefit.

We will work with, not against, the new Mayoral authority, focusing on what we can uniquely do locally to support economic growth. We will put the infrastructure in place to allow businesses to thrive, and supporting local entrepreneurs to turn their ideas into reality.

We want all of our young people to have the best start in life. Newcastle Liberal Democrats will deliver good quality school places where and when they're needed. Under us, the Council delivers its statutory responsibilities, and more, to support young people with Special Educational Needs.

If you live in social housing, you can count on us to prioritise effective repairs and maintenance over excuses and delay. We will invest in insulation, energy efficiency and mould prevention, improving quality of life and driving down properties' carbon footprint. Lib Dem Councils across the country have a strong record of building more social housing: we will repeat that here.

We will get the City moving, so that everyone can get to where they need to. That means investing in the Council's ability to design and deliver projects, stopping wasted funding. It means repairing our crumbling infrastructure, not putting the problem off for the future. It means creating an accessible, green City for all, so everyone can travel how they want to travel.





Stewardship of the Environment

When the Liberal Democrats led the Council, we were recognised for our leadership on the Environment. Since then, the Council has fallen behind.

Once a leader for recycling rates nationally, the City now diverts more and more waste to incinerators. We're a decade behind some cities in food waste recycling. Newcastle Liberal Democrats will divert more into genuine recycling routes. We will make our Household Waste Recycling Centres accessible to everyone again, saving money on tackling fly-tipping.

We believe our parks should be for the people, so we will return our green spaces to public accountability, prioritising public benefit over cash generation. We will invest in sustainable biodiversity, using modern green technologies to tackle urban drainage, support wildlife, and reduce our carbon footprint.

The City needs to support more active and sustainable transport, but too often the Council relies on the stick, with too little of the carrot, to change people's travel habits. We would reinvigorate strategic network planning, setting out a clear route to the future of City transport.

And as the Council looks to the future on housing, infrastructure, and the layout of the City, we will prioritise decent, affordable, energy efficient housing for all. We will deliver regeneration across the City, not just in the City Centre, and build a retail and business offer fit for the 21st Century.
